Arthur Scargill and his hungry miners are being begged to refuse a strike fund donation of £2,000 – the takings of the London School of Economics' fruit machines. The plea comes from the student union leader, Edward Lucas, who has been warned by the Treasury Solicitor's office that such payment would be illegal, breaching the student union's charitable status. Despite this warning the LSE students are defiant, and have voted to flout the law. Lucas, who has asked Scargill for an official letter of refusal, says: "The last thing the miners' union would want is students hurling themselves into confrontation with the law on their behalf."
